

## GEXcel International Collegium for Advanced Transdisciplinary Gender Studies Activity Report for the period September 2012 – September 2013

### 1. Background

In 2006, the Swedish Research Council granted 20 million SEK to establish a Centre of Gender Excellence (GEXcel), at the inter-university Institute of Thematic Gender Studies (GI), Linköping University & Örebro University for the period 2007-2011. GEXcel was created as a temporary (5 year), collegium-like excellence centre for Advanced Gender Studies. A core activity of GEXcel was a Visiting Fellowship Programme organised and defined by a number of thematic foci. Two international [peer evaluations](#), organised by the Swedish Research Council, praised its research, publications and ability to attract excellent national and international scholars within the framework of a number of cutting edge research themes.

### 2. Setting up the structure of the Collegium

Against this background, the GEXcel International Collegium for Advanced Transdisciplinary Gender Studies was established on a more permanent basis in 2012. The same year, the Gender Institute expanded to include Karlstad University, and the GEXcel International Collegium is now a three-university research collaboration including Tema Genus and the Division of Gender and Medicine at Linköping University (LiU), the Centre for Feminist Social Studies (CFS) and Gender Studies at Örebro University (ÖU), and the Centre for Gender Studies (CGF) at Karlstad University (KaU).

The aims of the GEXcel International Collegium are:

- To become a hub for Nordic, European and international research on transdisciplinary Gender Studies;
- To develop transnational, intersectional and transformative gender research;
- To provide a research infrastructure for both self-funded and funded visiting scholars of excellence;
- To become a meeting place for different generations of excellent gender scholars, and to support promising junior scholars committed to a career in Gender Studies;
- To secure close collaboration between the Collegium and international research training initiatives within the field of Gender Studies;
- To develop a global association of such kindred centres of advanced Gender Studies, provisionally known the Research International Network of Centres of Advanced Gender Studies RINGS);
- To provide a long-term base for the book series Routledge Advances in Feminist Studies and Intersectionality.

2012 and the first half of 2013 can be characterised as a transition period from the GEXcel Centre of Excellence to the GEXcel International Collegium. During 2012 and the first half of 2013 the Collegium infrastructure has been gradually set up, and the initial two-university Collegium has expanded to include a third partner university, Karlstad University. The integration of Karlstad into the initial LiU-ÖU cooperation was principally agreed by the Vice Chancellors of all three universities in the beginning of the summer 2013. *The renewed co-operation contract* between LiU and ÖU on the Gender Institute and the GEXcel Collegium, integrating KaU into the activities, is to be signed during the early autumn 2013.

The Collegium *executive board* was appointed and had its first meeting in September 2012 at ÖU and its second meeting in January 2013 at LiU. KaU appointed its executive board representatives in spring 2013.

*GEXcel Co-directors* were appointed in September 2012 for a one-year period: Nina Lykke and Cecilia Åsberg (LiU), and Liisa Husu and Anna G. Jónasdóttir (ÖU). The KaU Co-directors Ulf Mellström and Marie Nordberg were appointed in spring 2013. With the strategic funding allocated to each partner university by the respective universities (strategiska medel/rektorsmedel) KaU, LiU and ÖU have been able to appoint three part-time *GEXcel Collegium Coordinators*: Silje Lundgren (LiU); Magnus Åberg (KaU); and Sofia Strid (ÖU). From September 2012 and until September 2013, the Co-directors and the Coordinators have held seven meetings, of which two have been telephone meetings. The Co-directors have agreed on a division of labour.

An *International Reference Group* was set up during the spring and summer 2013. It may be complemented with a few additional experts if need arises to strengthen some key competence areas. The tasks of the members of the International Reference Group are to function as a 'sounding board' for ideas on development and future directions of the activities of the GEXcel International Collegium; to serve as ambassadors (e.g. promote and inform about activities) of the GEXcel International Collegium in their respective scholarly communities and countries; to contribute to the peer review process of GEXcel visiting scholars; and to support collaborations with other excellent gender studies centres and collegiums for advanced gender research worldwide.

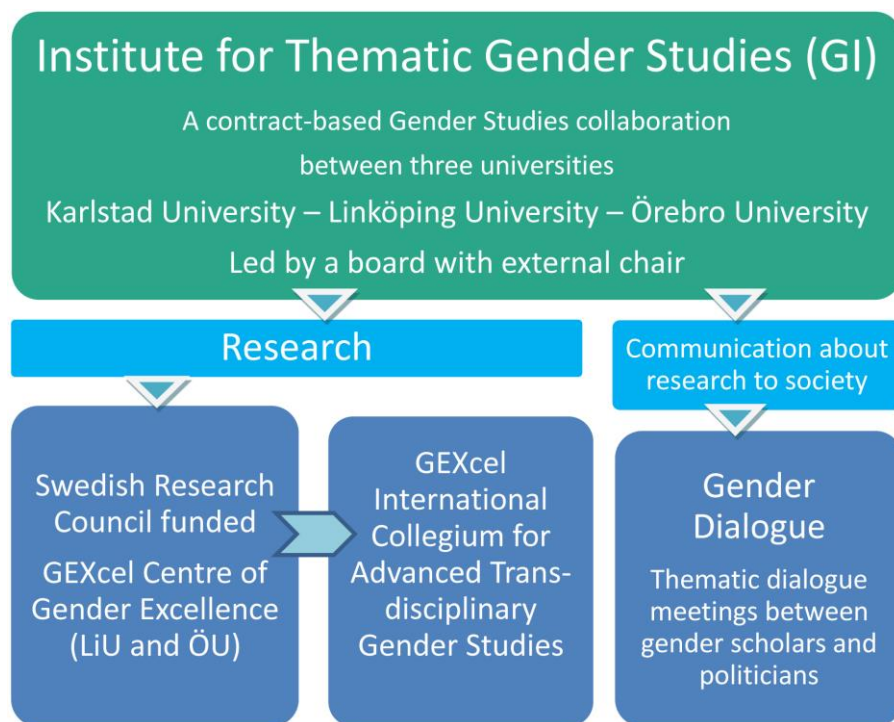
In return, all members of the International Reference Group will have a standing invitation as visiting scholars of GEXcel International Collegium at the universities of Karlstad, Linköping and Örebro, on the same principles as the Self-Funded Visiting Scholars.

Local Advisory Boards at each partner university have also been set up. The Local Advisory Boards help to anchor the activities of the GEXcel International Collegium in the broader local milieus.

Criteria for selecting visiting scholars have been set up.

## 2.2 RINGS network

The work towards securing a closer collaboration between the GEXcel International Collegium and similar Centres internationally and to develop a global association of such kindred centres of advanced Gender Studies has been on-going throughout the academic year. The working group set up to prepare the network, consisting of York University, UK, Humboldt University, Germany, Adelaide University, Australia, and GEXcel (represented by professor Jeff Hearn) has completed the draft constitution and done other preparations for the inaugural meeting of RINGS. Both York and then Humboldt initially offered to host the inaugural meeting but later declined, so it is now planned to hold the inaugural meeting in Örebro in 2014.

### 3. Kick-off events

Kick-off events for the broader university communities, cooperation partners and local gender studies milieus were organised at all three universities.

The Örebro kick-off took place at The Faculty Club (Fakultetsklubben) at ÖU on 16 May. #### 4. Research activities and events

The research activities of the GEXcel Collegium are to be organised in a small number of overarching *research fields*. These research fields will consist of several *research strands*, each with its own chair/s. Several on-going and planned *projects* can be included under one strand. Strands can be of two types: either *established strands*, which have funding for and include existing research projects and activities, or *emerging strands* for planned projects and activities grounded in the GEXcel milieu. Five initial [research fields](#) have been established in spring 2013: Bodily Assemblages; Gender and Organisations; Gender Challenges in Knowledge Production; Intersectionality and Transversal Dialogues; Love Studies; and Posthumanities with a Difference. Many fields draw on previous GEXcel research activities, several research projects and various forms of co-operation are already taking place within these fields, with the funding from the Swedish Research Council, the European Commission, the Swedish Civil Contingencies Agency (MSB) and internal university funding.
